



airBaltic Resumes Non-Stop Flights from Vienna to Tallinn as of March 2026

airBaltic is expanding its route network of flights departing from Vienna. Starting in March 2026, Latvia's national airline will operate two weekly flights to the Estonian capital city of Tallin. Flight service on this route was terminated due to the coronavirus pandemic and will be resumed once again. The airline will deploy a modern Airbus A220-300 aircraft. Tallinn will then be the second destination served by airBaltic from Vienna Airport in addition to Riga, Latvia. By resuming flight service to Tallinn, the leading airline in the Baltic States is further expanding its offering, thus strengthening flight connections at Vienna Airport to Northeastern Europe.

"In its role as the biggest airline in the Baltic States, airBaltic is an indispensable partner for ensuring travel connections to this region. The airline has been an integral part of the offering at Vienna Airport for more than 20 years now. The resumption of direct flights to Tallinn sends out a strong signal highlighting our successful collaboration and the relevance of this flight connection. Tallinn is one of the most diverse destinations in Northern Europe and delights visitors thanks to its medieval charm, digital innovativeness and a high quality of life," states Julian Jäger, Joint CEO and COO of the Vienna Airport operating company Flughafen Wien AG.

"Demand for our services continues to grow in Austria, and we are pleased to further strengthen our presence in Vienna with the launch of direct flights to Tallinn. With this addition, airBaltic now connects the Austrian capital with two Baltic capitals, including its long-standing route to Riga, Latvia. The new connection will support stronger business ties as well as leisure travel between the regions," Mantas Vrubliauskas, VP Network Management at airBaltic.

Two weekly flights from Vienna to Tallinn

The new direct flight connection will be launched on 30 March 2026. airBaltic will operate two flights per week i.e., on Mondays and Fridays, deploying a modern Airbus A220-300 aircraft to link Vienna and Tallinn. Flight times are attractive for both business and leisure travellers. The flight will depart from Tallinn at 10:45 a.m. on Mondays and arrive in Vienna at 12:15 p.m. The return flight will leave Vienna Airport at 12:55 p.m. and land in Tallinn at 4:15 p.m. The plane is scheduled to take off from Tallinn at 7:10 a.m. every Friday and arrive in Vienna at 8:40 a.m. The return flight will leave Vienna Airport at 9:20 a.m. and touch down in Tallinn at 12:40 p.m. Flight service was already offered in the years 2015 to 2020 and is now being resumed after a five-year break.

Tallinn: Dynamic capital city located directly on the sea

The Estonian capital of Tallinn is considered to be one of the most attractive cities in Northern Europe. The medieval Tallinn Old Town is on the UNESCO World Heritage List and lures visitors due to its historic flair, narrow streets and baroque buildings. At the same time, Tallinn is seen as a digital showcase city featuring a flourishing startup scene, modern infrastructure and a high quality of life. It is an ideal place for city and business trips or discovering the attractions along the Baltic Sea coast.
