Traffic Results 2023 & Outlook for 2024



2023: 2nd best year in Vienna Airport history Record capacity utilisation of the airlines – VIE sets quality benchmarks

- Economic rebound effects following Covid-19 continued in 2023 2nd best traffic results in Flughafen Wien's history
 29.5 million passengers in 2023 (+24.7% vs. 2022) corresponds to 93.3% of the record year 2019
 High seat load factor of 80.5% airlines register record capacity utilisation
- Vienna Airport sets quality benchmarks high degree of international recognition
 3rd most punctual airline hub in Europe, 5th most punctual airport in Europe and most punctual hub in the Lufthansa Group – airlines and industry organisations honour VIE for its punctuality and handling performance
- Vienna Airport invests in quality and sustainability
 - New Southern Expansion: ground-breaking ceremony on 14 February, completion scheduled for 2027, tenant acquisition in progress, 70,000 m² of additional terminal space, centralised security checks, multifaceted shopping, food & beverage and lounge offering
 - Vienna Airport is already CO₂-neutral next target: net zero by 2033
- Outlook for 2024: about 30 million passengers expected aviation remains a growth sector
- Financial guidance 2024: Record sales of around € 970 million and net profit of at least € 210 million

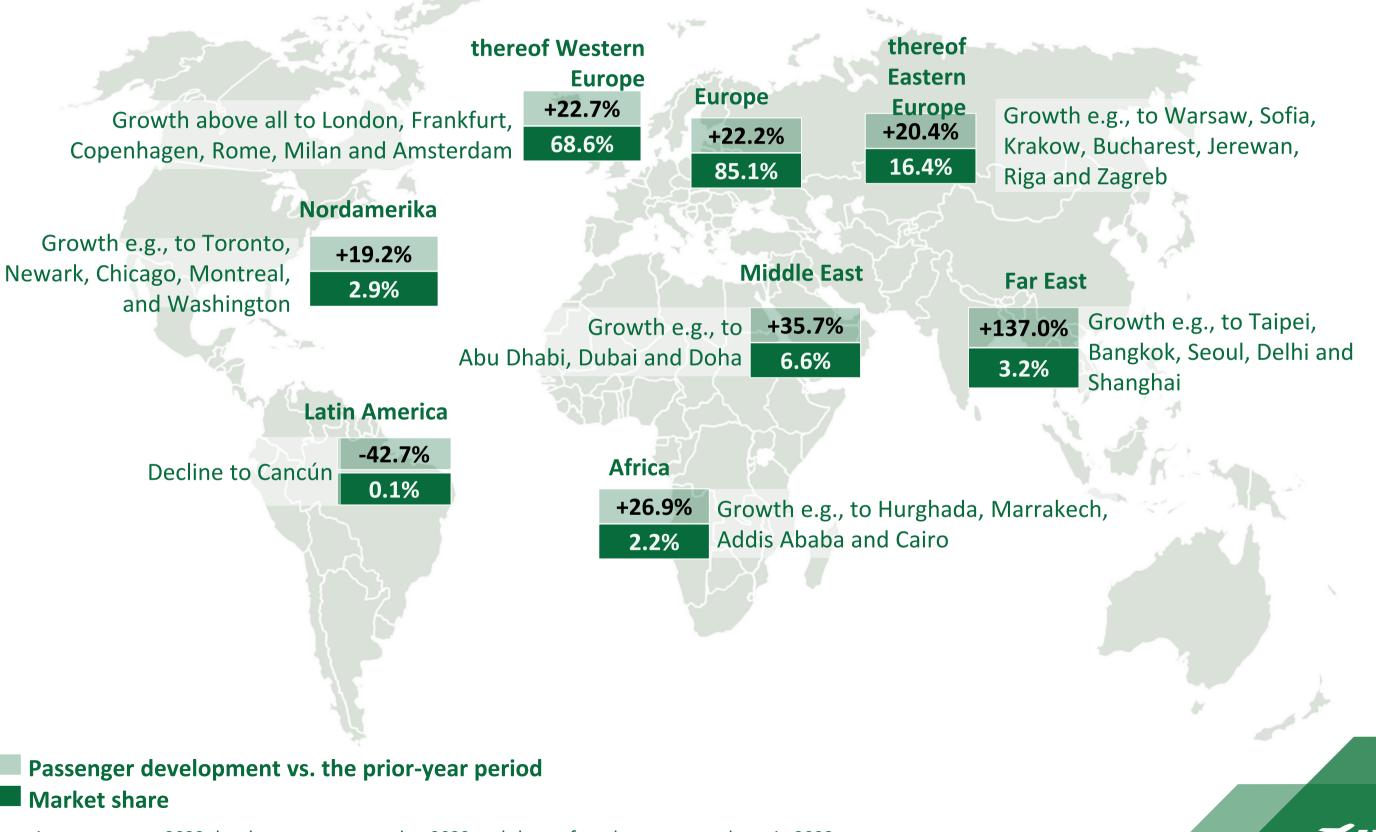

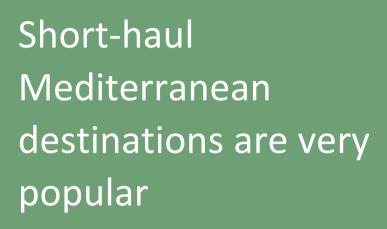

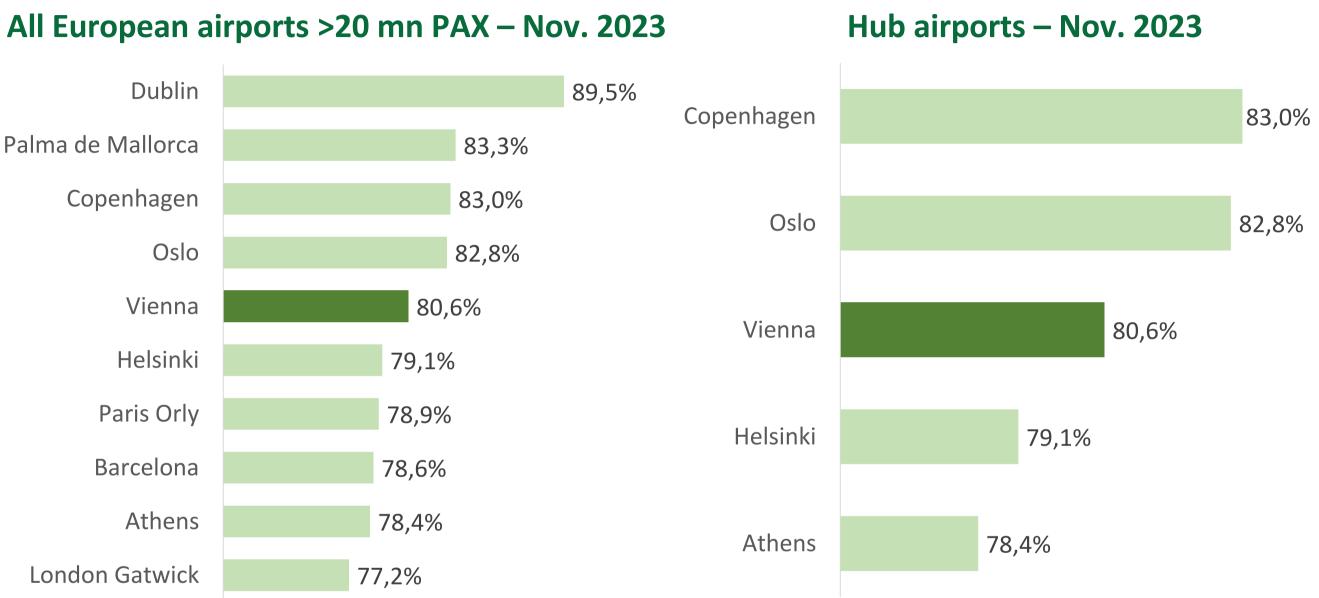

Airline comebacks and resumption of flight service Expanded destination offering at Vienna Airport in 2023

- Air India back since February with flights to Delhi
- Azerbaijan Airlines has been flying from Vienna to Baku since May
- **Ethiopian Airlines** has also been offering flights to **Copenhagen** alongside Addis Ababa since May
- Jet2.com is back with flight service to Birmingham and Manchester

Outlook

- Fleet modernisation and expansion at Austrian Airlines 10 state-of-the-art Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft in operation by 2028
- Long-haul routes: further recovery to Asian destinations is expected

Airport Malta Very good year in 2023, investments in the future

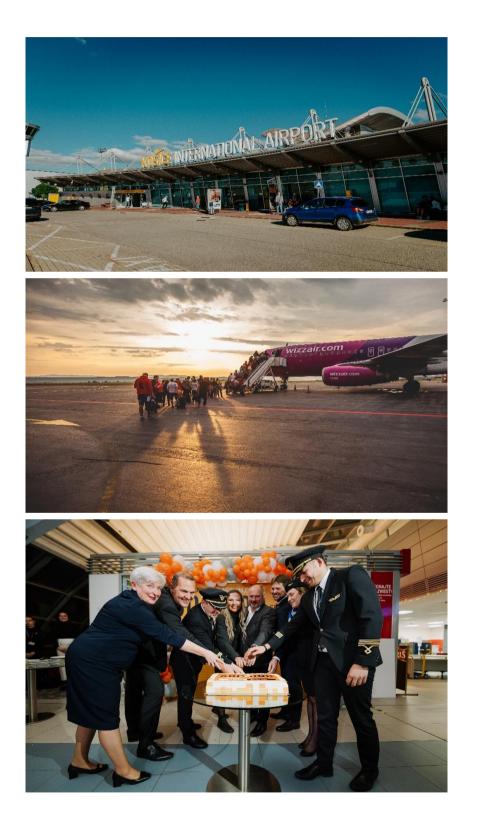

Airport Košice 600,000+ passengers for the first time in 2023, new flight connections in 2024



- Best year in the airport's history featuring approx. 620,000 passengers, rise of 15.2% in 2023 vs. the previous year
- Passenger volume in 20
 2019)
- New charter flight record (197,000 Pax) and for a single month (103,204 Pax in August 2023, more than 100,000 in any month for the very first time)
- Strong growth of Ryanair and Austrian Airlines, significantly higher seat load factor
- New flight connections to Zurich as of March 2024 (3x/week) and Zadar (2x/week, seasonal route April September)
- High demand for logistics space accompanies large investment by Volvo (development of an e-vehicle plant by 2026 nearby)
- 2024 "100 years of flying in Košice"

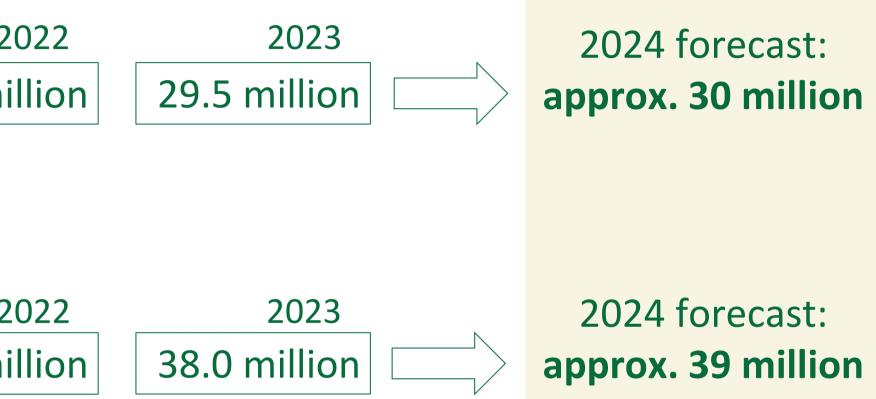

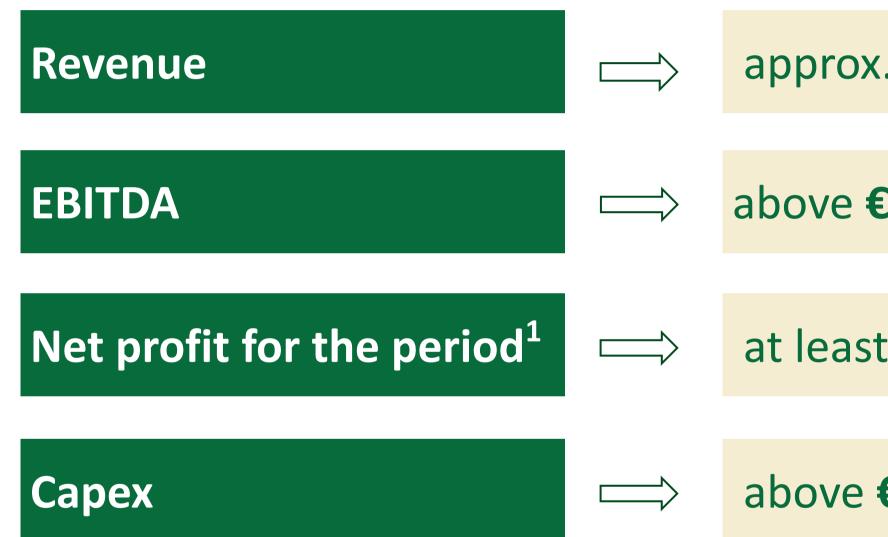
Outlook reflects strong sales & earnings improvement Investment drive with Capex of over € 200 million

- Optimistic financial outlook for 2024
 - → best profit for the period so far of at least € 210 million
 - EBITDA of over € 390 million
 - → Sales of around € 970 million
- Company is debt-free EIB loan repaid early at the end of 2023 ____
- Flughafen Wien launches investment drive and **invests over € 200 million in 2024**
- New all-time high for the share price in October 2023, price increase of 57% in 2023
- Growth in all areas creates 700 additional jobs at the airport site

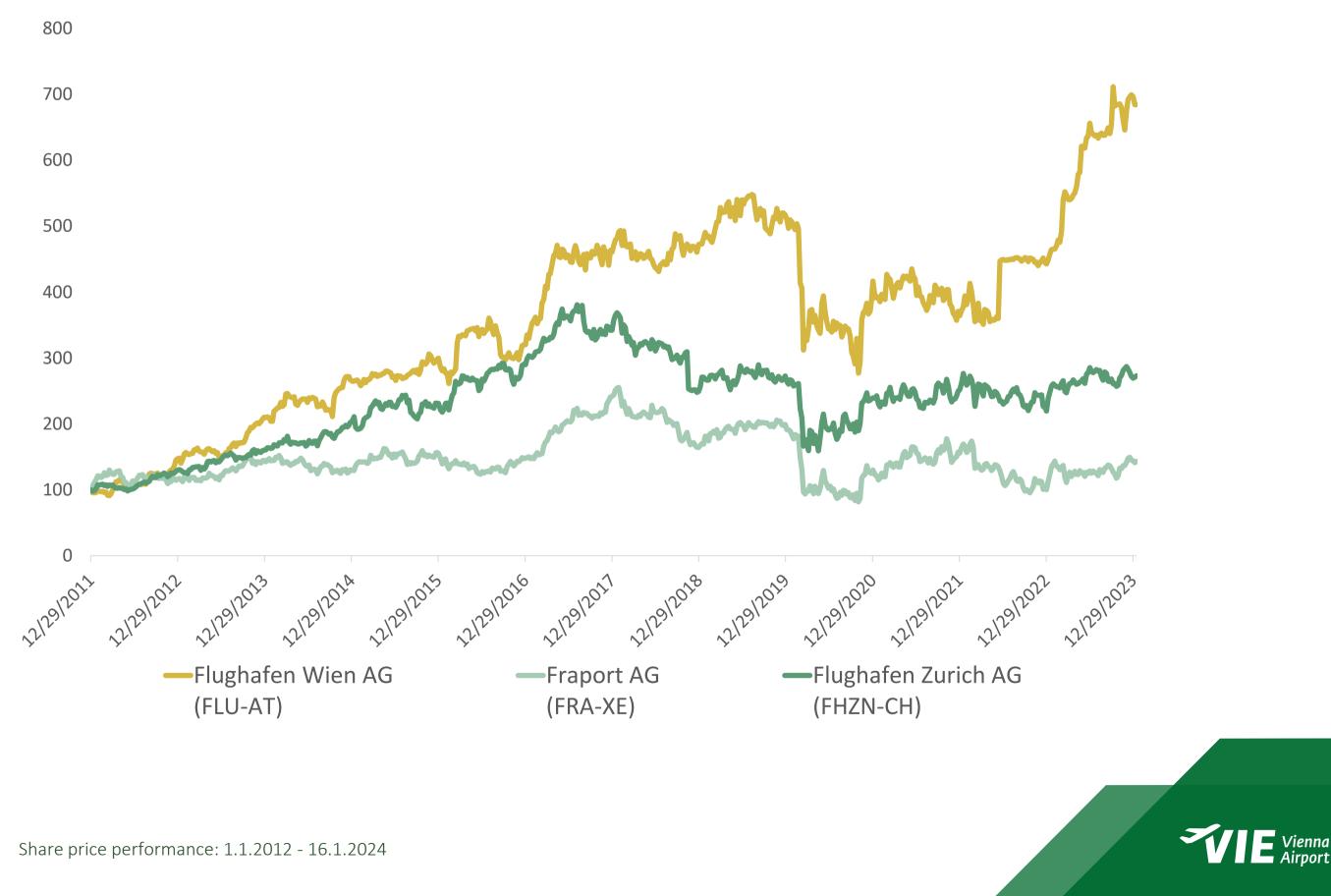

Financial highlights Q1-3/2023 Strong rise in earnings and complete elimination of debt

Earnings Q1-3/2023 > Q1-3/2019

- Substantial earnings rise in Q1-3/2023 compared to the previous year (EBITDA +30%, net profit for the period +60%)
- Improved revenue and earnings indicators in Q1-3/2023 vs. Q1-3/2019
- Higher revenue as a consequence of strong growth in passenger traffic and flight movements, indexation of fees and a positive financial result were responsible for the very good development.

Complete elimination of debt

- Net liquidity of € 299 million in Q3/2023 vs. € 149 million in debt at the end of 2022 thanks to strong cash generation
- Comfortable **financial leeway** for investments and attractive dividends
- Improved financial result due to increased level of investment and higher interest rates in Q1-3/2023
- Redemption of outstanding EIB loans (€ 200 million) in Q4/2023
- Flughafen Wien AG will report on the preliminary business results for the 2023 financial year on 28 February 2024.



Significant cost pressure Indexation of fees provides protection against inflation

- Major cost increases for materials, personnel, energy and third-party services; in addition to operational and traffic-related rises, the increase in the general price level is clearly perceptible
- Rise in personnel expenses as an influencing factor: higher salaries mandated by collective wage agreements in 2023: 1 January (+5.6%) and 1 May (+11.8%)
- Indexation of fees offers protection against inflation
 - Temporary suspension of the pricing model (derived from PAX growth and inflation) until 2026 due to Covid-19related distortions since 2020
 - → Adjustment of airport fees by the average inflation rate (calculated from 1 August 31 July)
- Increases in 2024:

Passenger fees	+9.7%
Landing & infrastructure fees	+9.7%



Gradual greening of European air traffic National action plan urgently needed

- EU law obliges us to increase the addition of alternative jet fuel from as early as next year
- Quantities required for Austria: from 2025: 20,000 tonnes/year from 2030: 50,000 tonnes/year from 2035: 200,000 tonnes/year
- No sufficient production in sight at present
- National action plan to promote the production of alternative jet fuels urgently needed
 - → Location initiative to promote production facilities in Austria (biogenic feedstocks)
 - → Earmarking the revenue from the flight tax for CO₂ reduction by promoting the use of Sustainable Aviation Fuels (SAFs)
 - → Research funding to improve processes



AirportCity: Record level of business location projects 20 new companies add 700 new jobs







- Boom in business location projects: 20 new companies will add 700 new jobs at the airport hub (Enpulsion, Atlas Copco, Quehenberger, AT Plus, Boutique Aviation, AT Intermodal, ACS Logistics, Murrelectronik, Kalmar, FMS Solution etc.)
- Future Zone East near Fischamend: 1,800 new jobs already created in the region (including new business location projects)
- Construction of the Helios Logistics Park is progressing Austria's largest logistics park covering 80,000 m² to open in autumn 2024
- Enpulsion starts a product AirportCity
- Launch of construction for a new hotel with 510 rooms in the spring of 2024 expansion of accommodation capacities to 1,400 rooms in the future
 - **Austria's strongest real estate brand for the 4th time:** the AirportCity wins the European Real Estate Brand Award.

CO₂-neutral airport operations since January 2023

Photovoltaic facilities, e-mobility, CO₂-neutral geothermal energy/district heat, new technologies and countless other measures to improve energy efficiency have enabled the airport to steadily reduce CO₂ emissions: savings of 60,000 tonnes of CO₂ p.a. since 2011; more than a 40% reduction of energy consumption per traffic

Photovoltaic expansion to about 45 MWp promotes the reliability of the energy supply and reduces dependency on energy costs - thus covering about 50% of total electricity requirements of the entire airport hub

New in 2024: large electric filling station for passengers with quick charging stations - charging capacity of 185 KW per charging station – charging completed
