



2021: positive net profit for the period despite the coronavirus crisis; 2022: economic upswing expected



- The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in the worst crisis in the history of aviation: <u>positive</u> Group net profit for the period achieved in spite of passenger volumes of approx. 30% of the pre-crisis level of 2019
- → Growth in revenue to € 407.0 million in 2021 (2020: € 333.7 million) and a positive Group net profit of € 6.6 million (2020: minus € -75.7 million) the airport soundly managed the crisis thanks to a comprehensive cost savings programme, low level of net debt and short-time work short-time work terminated at the end of March 2022
- An **upswing is on the horizon** in 2022 despite uncertainty related to further developments in Ukraine and the course of the pandemic: Q1/2022 was already promising, there is an extensive desire for holiday trips, and for this reason a strong summer season is expected
- → New Group-wide **strategy development process** started
- Competition for the best talents and employer branding as key issues for future development
- → Vienna Airport resolutely continued its sustainability drive: Austria's largest photovoltaic plant was put into operation in May 2022 Vienna Airport will operate in an entirely CO₂-neutral manner in 2023 and thus become a "green airport"
- Innovation and digitalisation are important problem solvers to meet current challenges
- → The airport hub is growing also during and after the crisis: **new business location projects create about 1,000 new jobs**



Q1/2022: significant rise in passenger volumes and earnings vs. prior year



- → Five-fold increase in passenger volumes in Q1/2022 to 3.7 million passengers in the Group, but still only about half of the pre-crisis level
- → Considerable improvement of financial indicators: revenue up 92.9% and a net profit before non-controlling interests of € 6.7 million supported by income from a property sale

→ Guidance for 2022:

Flughafen Wien AG expects about 17 million travellers at Vienna Airport and approx. 21 million in the Flughafen Wien Group in the entire year 2022.

The Flughafen Wien Group anticipates revenue of approx. € 560 million, a positive EBITDA of at least € 172 million and a Group net profit of at least € 20 million in 2022. The net debt of the company will likely decline to below € 50 million. Investments will equal about € 84 million.

A continued outperformance of passenger traffic compared to the budgeted figures would positively impact the expected business results, especially cash flow, EBITDA and the net profit. Further developments in Ukraine and the course of the pandemic remain difficult to predict. A revised guidance is expected no later than at the time of publication of the Half-Year Results 2022.

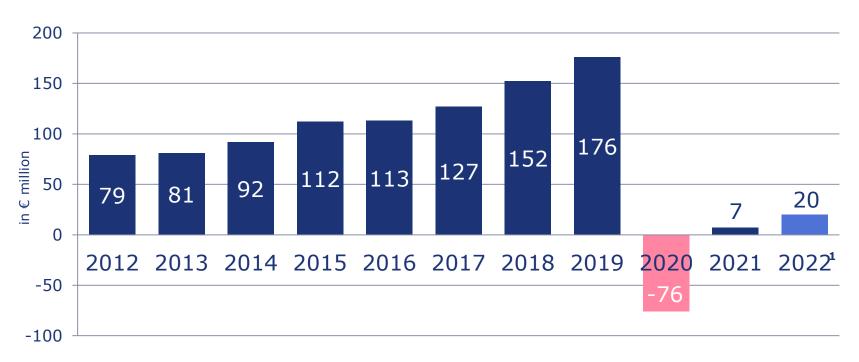

[→] Increasing revenue, higher other operating income and government aid led to a positive net profit for the period for the first time since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic amounting to € 6.6 million.

- → Net debt fell substantially to € 150.4 million
- → Cash flow from operating activities was once again positive, thus also leading to a positive free cash flow (€ 66.9 million)
- → Considerable reduction in CAPEX², equity ratio rose to 63.4%

Focus on sustainability: Austria's largest photovoltaic plant put into operation at Vienna Airport in May 2022



- Output of about 24 MW peak supplied by photovoltaic installations spanning an area of about 24 hectares
- Eight PV facilities will generate 30 million KWh of electricity in the future one-third of Vienna Airport's entire electricity requirements!





2023: Vienna Airport will operate as a CO₂-neutral "green airport"



Vienna Airport is significantly reducing its CO₂ emissions thanks to eight photovoltaic facilities, CO₂-neutral district heat and other projects.

- Vienna Airport operates eight photovoltaic plants on the airport grounds as of May 2022, with one-third of the airport's electricity needs supplied by solar energy in the future
- → Vienna Airport will be supplied with CO₂-neutral district heat from industrial waste heat utilisation, resulting in an 85% drop in CO₂ emissions by 85% since 2012
- More than 450 electric-powered vehicles in use already, conversion to LED lighting, and the new Office Park 4 is one of Austria's most sustainable office buildings featuring geothermal energy and photovoltaic use
- → Vienna Airport will operate in a CO₂-neutral manner as of 2023







Innovation, digitalisation and automation as responses to current and future challenges

- → Innovation, digitalisation and automation are the main trends

- > Occupational safety and health care as key priorities

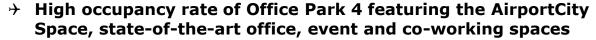


Vienna Airport is growing strongly: many business location projects create 1,000 new jobs at the site

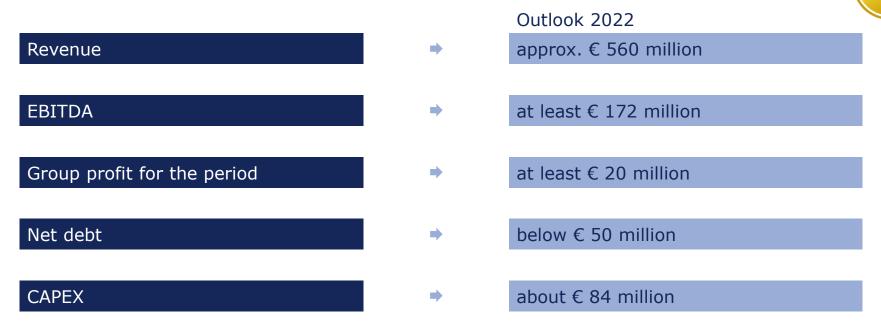

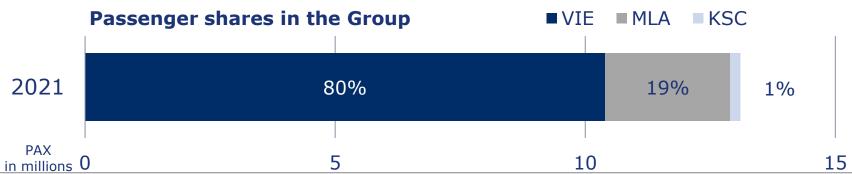

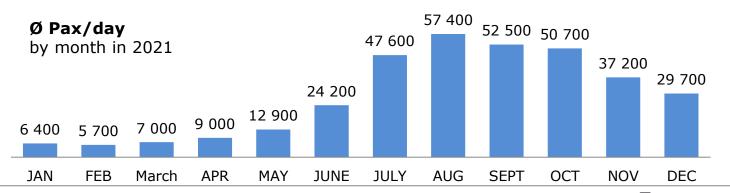


Passenger traffic: highlights in 2021

Flughafen Wien AG



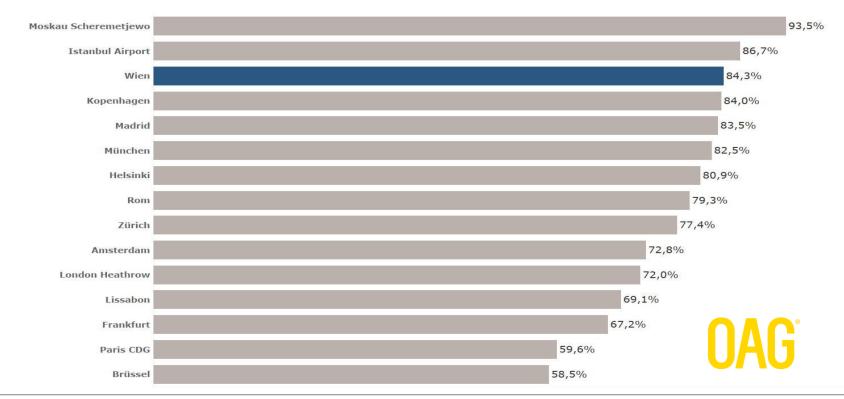
- → Vienna Airport was served by **66 airlines** from January to December 2021 flying to **190 destinations** in **63** countries in scheduled flight traffic (2019: 77 airlines, 217 destinations, 68 countries).
- → Less than one-fifth of total annual passenger traffic was handled in the first half of the year.
- → **Top 5 countries** in terms of passenger volumes: Germany, Spain, Greece, Italy and Turkey.
- → **Recovery** due to **vaccinations** and the **Green Pass** perceptible in the passenger traffic figures starting in **June**.

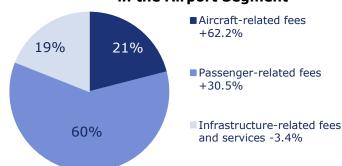
Airport: EBITDA and EBIT improvement thanks to recovery of passenger traffic



- Much higher revenue due to recovery of passenger volumes and flight movements
- → Income from aircraft-related fees rose
 62.2% year-on-year to € 36.2 million:
 € 22.3 million) and passenger-related fees
 climbed 30.5% in 2021 to € 101.7 million
 (2020: € 77.9 million). In contrast,
 infrastructure-related fees and services
 declined by 3.4% to € 31.7 million (2020:
 € 32.8 million)
- → EBITDA and EBIT improved as a result of the increased passenger traffic

Revenue distribution 2021 in the Airport Segment



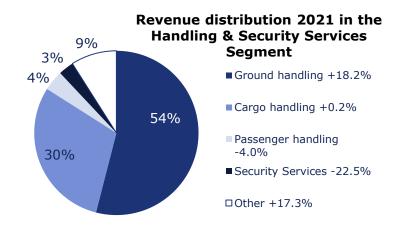


Handling & Security Services: higher revenue due to the volume increase



- → Proceeds from ground handling up 18.2% to € 51.4 million
- → Income from cargo handling of € 28.3 million at the prior-year level
- → Material costs rose 7.1% year-on-year to € 4.8 million
- → Drop in personnel expenses of 7.3% in 2021 to € 102.4 million (2020: € 110.5 million), for example as the consequence of the decrease in the average number of employees

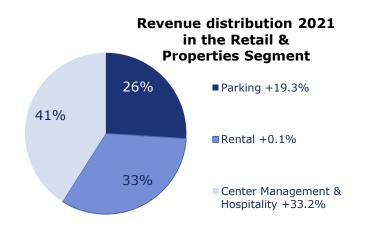


Retail & Properties: increased revenue, strong earnings improvement

- → Higher proceeds from Center Management & Hospitality, rising 33.2% to € 34.1 million (2020: € 25.6 million)
- → Parking income up 19.3% year-on-year, from € 17.6 million to € 21.0 million
- → In contrast, rental income showed a stable development, amounting to € 27.3 million (+0.1%)
- → More domestic catering at the airport in 2022: Wolfgang Puck, Bieder & Maier, Veganista/The LaLa and Trzesniewski are opening restaurants

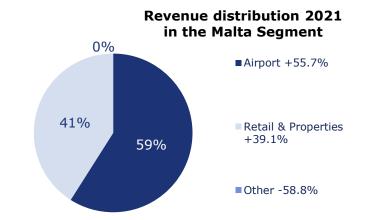


Malta: increased revenue and earnings



- → Airport-related income climbed 55.7% year-on-year to € 27.8 million, a rise primarily attributable to higher passenger volumes
- → Retail & Properties revenue rose by 39.1% to € 19.5 million
- → Personnel expenses declined 24% to € 6.6 million (2020: € 8.6 million) due to lower average number of employees, amongst other factors

- → Tonnage in 2022 (1-4) only 8% below 2019
- → Strong growth of belly cargo (+945) despite delays in resuming flight service on long-haul routes (especially Asia)
- → Decline in purely cargo flights (-15%)
- → Slight drop in trucking (-4%)
- → Increase in export volumes (+9%) vs. slight decrease in imports (-3%)
- → Strong growth of pharmaceutical handling (+145%) (Q1 2022)
- → Market share of VIE cargo handling: 80%



Outlook for the summer of 2022

- → **Positive outlook** for the upcoming summer months
 - → ~60 airlines with up to 190 destinations in 60 countries
 - → Numerous offerings in Europe and the Mediterranean

Austrian Airlines with 110 destinations and 1,300 weekly frequencies

Focus mainly on tourist destinations in Greece, Spain and Italy

New in the flight schedule: Kavala, Valencia and Samos

Resumption of flight service: Los Angeles, Gothenburg and Bologna,

numerous frequency increases on existing routes

Ryanair operates flights to more than 90 destinations

Flight service initiated to Amman, Genoa, Lamezia Terme, Manchester, Rimini and Venice, amongst other destinations, and numerous frequency increases

New airlines: Condor since the beginning of it April

Jazeera Airways announced as of the end of June

Back to VIE: Air Corsica, EVA Air, Flynas, Kuwait Airways and Korean Air

- → Good cooperation with the home carrier (Austrian Airlines)
- > Recovery of connectivity to strengthen the hub function
- → Redevelopment of various markets (e.g., Germany and UK)
- > Marketing of Vienna as a destination
 - → Focus: long-haul flight connections from metropolitan regions with high incoming potential and cooperation with network carriers to promote the hub function of the airport
- → Close cooperation with all key stakeholders
- → Expansion of intermodality (development of the catchment area)
- → Sustainability Net Zero 2050

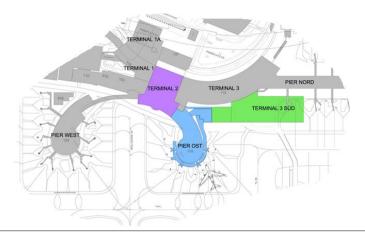
